ow can I keep my faith active and alive from Sunday to Sunday?" a woman asked me a few weeks ago. That's a really good question; and I am impressed with this woman's desire to keep her faithwalk alive every day.

H. George Anderson, a Lutheran pastor, picked up on something Martin Luther said: that we should every day remind ourselves of our Baptism. Pastor Anderson said, "Baptism is not a ten minute ceremony that happens to babies. It takes a lifetime to complete. Martin Luther called Baptism 'the daily garment which the Christian is to wear all the time.' That is, the pattern of our Christian life comes from the continuous arc of Baptism: being brought low, washed, and then raised up. Every day is a new experience of that cycle-- recognizing our sins, remembering we are Baptized as children of God, and then being invigorated by the assurance of forgiveness.

"In Baptism we discover our relationship with God is not based on what we do, but what God in Christ has done. The ground of our relationship with God is mercy and forgiveness rather than justice. So each day we need to remind ourselves of God's mercy and forgiveness."

That's good advice. Each day in the morning (or at night, or both times) remind yourself that you have sinned, strive to do better, that Jesus Christ died for your sins, and that through Christ you are a forgiven sinner and an eternal child of God.

That is a great way to start (or end) each day. See you at worship!

# CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES—SEPTEMBER 21, 2010

The meeting was opened by Pastor who gave the devotion. Keith Mullen ran the meeting since Bill Caldwell was working out of town. The minutes for May were read. Jim Sommers motioned to accept them and Mike Winslow seconded. Motion passed. Minutes for August were read. Dave Warnke motioned to accept them Larry Paul seconded them. Motion passed. The treasurer's report was also accepted from May and Aug.

**Treasurer's Report-**Lisa Anderson gave the report. There has been a YTD shortfall of \$35,000 against expenses. August was slightly ahead of expenses mainly due to the 29<sup>th</sup> service. Next Sunday, Jim and Lisa will give a summary of giving over the last few months. Our current fund needs help to meet monthly expenses. Dave Warnke motioned and Dick Haar seconded to accept the report. Motion passed.

**Board of Ed.-**Julie Gallaher talked about rally day's success. About 45 kids attended rally day. Thirty-three showed up the following Sunday. There is a desire for a young adult class, and it is being worked on. There is a theme for every week of Sunday School for the teachers to follow. The Sunday School board is very appreciative of their new area. There may be a need for another table and chairs for a set of kindergartners during Sunday School.

#### **Elders Report-**No report

Property Mgt-Bees nest has been taken care of. Windows in gym may need a few repairs for the screens. Fire suppression needs to be done for insurance purposes and will cost around \$2000. Gary motioned to have it taken care of, and Bernie Erdmann seconded it. Motion passed. Chris Hunsaker offered monies from WELCA to help pay for it. All deeds have been recorded for the new pieces of property the church has acquired. The water in the restrooms needs to be worked on for temperature control, so new valves will be installed. Eaves will be cleaned out.

**Finance Report-**Jim Sommers mentioned the committee will put together the budget for 2011. He asked for submissions from the various committees. They will meet in October to start putting it together. They will need to think about maintaining a budget

that will meet the church's expenses. Jim discussed copyright laws and will renew the CCL license. It will be around \$300 for copyright permissions. The church participates in the Kroger rewards program. Every year people need to recharge it to keep a percentages of the purchases going to First St. John. Everyone has to do their own card online.

**Youth Report**-Mary Darling-Gilson handed out a sheet about the RENEW student ministry goals. She also had her schedule for the youth through June of next year. Mary asked for adult volunteers to help with the Trunk or Treat event on Oct 24.

**Dayschool Report**-Barb Shellhammer gave the report for the school. School is going well. They will have a feast in November. She also gave the dates for the Christmas programs. She was very happy with the August 29<sup>th</sup> service. She feels that parents and children will grow in their faith as long as we keep reaching out to them and feeding them. Barb is now using the bookkeeping system for her budget.

**Pastor's Report-**Pastor had 2 transfers pending into our church. Mary Darling-Gilson is teaching 7<sup>th</sup> grade catechism. Pastor is teaching 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Marc Miller is director of Evangelical Mission, and he would like to come and talk about this at our church. He will be here on October 17<sup>th</sup> to talk about the synod and stewardship.

**Old Business-**The bereavement committee has asked to be reimbursed for expenses. They used to have their own checking account, and they have elected to do away with the checking account in exchange for a credit card. Jim has offered that possibility. A motion was made by Gary Henningsen and seconded by Mike Winslow. The motion passed.

#### **New Business**-No new business

Joanne Henningsen motioned to adjourn the meeting; Bernie Erdmann seconded it and the motion passed. The meeting ended by saying the Lord's Prayer together.
