

We cannot will to bear God's fruit. Becoming God's children and bearing God's fruit, rather, come only through abiding in Christ. And this comes as a gift through Jesus. "I am the true vine. . . apart from me you can do nothing," Jesus tells his disciples. The vine must nourish the branches. Just so, we must drink God's life into our bodies and spirits. This is a purpose of worship and devotions. Staying connected to Jesus is critical and vital. In this way Christ abides in us and we abide in him.
