

- P: Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you and worthily magnify your holy name, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Announcements

Introduction

Someone who isn't part of Jesus' own circle is casting out demons in Jesus' name, and the disciples want him stopped. They appeal to Jesus, as Joshua did to Moses about the elders who prophesied without official authorization. Like Moses, Jesus refuses to see this as a threat. Jesus welcomes good being done in his name, even when it is not under his control. The circle we form around Jesus' word must be able to value good being done in ways we wouldn't do it, by people we can't keep tabs on.

FIRST READING: James 5:13-20

Marks of the Christian community include praying for those who are sick and in need, celebrating with those in good health, restoring those who have strayed, confessing sins to one another, and offering forgiveness to each other.

¹³Are any among you suffering? They should pray. Are any cheerful? They should sing songs of praise. ¹⁴Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. ¹⁵The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up; and anyone who has committed sins will

be forgiven. ¹⁶Therefore confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, so that you may be healed. The prayer of the righteous is powerful and effective. ¹⁷Elijah was a human being like us, and he prayed fervently that it might not rain, and for three years and six months it did not rain on the earth. ¹⁸Then he prayed again, and the heaven gave rain and the earth yielded its harvest.

¹⁹My brothers and sisters, if anyone among you wanders from the truth and is brought back by another, ²⁰you should know that whoever brings back a sinner from wandering will save the sinner's soul from death and will cover a multitude of sins.



On the way to Jerusalem, Jesus teaches his disciples about ministry that involves service and sacrifice. His disciples are slow to realize that these words apply to them as well as to others.

³⁸John said to [Jesus], "Teacher, we saw someone casting out demons in your name, and we tried to stop him, because he was not following us." ³⁹But Jesus said, "Do not stop him; for no one who does a deed of power in my name will be able soon afterward to speak evil of me. ⁴⁰Whoever is not against us is for us. ⁴¹For truly I tell you, whoever gives you a cup of water to drink because you bear the name of Christ will by no means lose the reward.

September 29, 2024 19TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Obstacle Course

Remember when obstacles used to be fun? An obstacle course let you test your speed and agility by crawling over this, dodging that, wiggling through something else.

Adult obstacles don't seem to be as fun. There is always something we are dealing with, something in the way, something blocking our happiness, our peace of mind, or the ability to achieve our goals. Difficult people, institutions, unforeseen illness, or stress can all be obstacles, as can scandals that test our faith in politics, families, religion, or human nature.

In today's gospel Jesus is giving a course in obstacles. He warns against causing others to stumble in their faith. It would be better to have a heavy weight around your neck and jump in the ocean than to cause those without power or sophistication to stumble. And if a certain body part causes you to sin, it would be better to limp and grope than to be cast into hell.

There are obstacles to taking this text literally. When interpreting the scriptures we must look at context and intent. This scripture seems to be saying, take this seriously: following Jesus is no casual thing. Our words and deeds do make a difference, for good or ill.

As we gather this day for worship we may feel the weight of the obstacles in our path or the rock of guilt around our neck. Yet, the gospel of forgiveness is about clearing obstacles. It's not about mutilating our bodies, but about God tearing down the barriers that divide us from one another or keep us from claiming our birthright as God's children. God gives us a community where we confess our sins, hear the good news, and then depart to let our words and deeds make a difference in the world. With God's help we can make our way through and around the obstacles, and even clear some of them away.
