4-year-old boy was asked to give thanks before Thanksgiving dinner. His family bowed their heads in expectation. He began his prayer, thanking God for all his friends, naming them one by one. Then he thanked God for Mommy, Daddy, brother, sister, Grandma, Grandpa, and all his aunts and uncles. Then he began to thank God for the food. He gave thanks for the turkey, the dressing, the fruit salad, the cranberry sauce, the pies, the cakes, even the Cool Whip. Then he paused, and everyone waited -- and waited. After a long silence, the young fellow looked up at his mother and asked, If I thank God for the broccoli, won't he know that I'm lying?"

Another little boy found something unique to give thanks for. As his parents listened, he prayed, "And God bless Mommy and Daddy . . . and thank you for sending Jesus to wash away our sins . . . so that we can have new ones."

During November our minds turn to Thanksgiving, and we have much for which to be thankful. Yet, how easy it is to forget by taking for granted so many of the good gifts from God. In fact, it often seems that the more we have, the less gratitude we feel.

The story is told about a woman named Carol who decided she wanted to do something nice for her neighbor, Mrs. Jones, so she baked a pie and carried it next door. When Mrs. Jones opened her door, she was surprised to see Carol holding the pie. She replied, "For me? Oh, thank you so much! You just don't know how much I appreciate it! You are so thoughtful for doing this! Thank you!"

Because Mrs. Jones liked the pie so much, Carol decided the next week to bake her another one. When she took it over, Mrs. Jones opened the door and said, "Thank you so much. You are so kind!"

When she took another pie over the following week, Mrs. Jones simply replied, "Thanks." Carol took another pie over the next week and Mrs. Jones responded, "You are a day late with this pie."

The following week she baked her another pie. This time her neighbor said, "Try using a little more sugar and don't bake it quite as long. The crust has been a little bit hard lately. And I'd like cherry instead of apple filling next time."

The next week Carol was so busy, she was unable to cook for her neighbor. When Carol passed by her house on the way to the store, Mrs. Jones looked through the window and noticed she wasn't carrying a pie. She then stuck her head out the window and yelled, "Where's my pie?!"

It's so easy to get used to our blessings. After enjoying them for a while, we begin to think we deserve them. Then instead of being thankful, we start complaining. It's a process that occurs so slowly, we don't even realize it's happening. Our attitude has changed from being grateful to ungrateful.

Pastor and author Bruce Larson makes the point that true freedom comes in an attitude of gratitude" He add, "Gratitude is a freeing emotion. It allows one to see beauty in everyday situations. It springs from humility. People who expect the world to cater to them cannot be grateful. People who cannot be grateful are never satisfied. An attitude of gratitude often leads to contentment, and contentment goes hand in hand with inner peace and joy. So those who are not grateful are often lacking in inner peace and joy. The least grateful people are usually the loudest complainers."

Is it any wonder that the Bible contains over 250 verses that contain the word 'Thank' or some form such as 'Thanks' or 'Thanksgiving'. Is it any wonder that Martin Luther began both his morning prayer and evening prayer by saying; "I give thanks to you, heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ vour dear Son . . . "

So, whether it is November or September or June or July, what a wonderful way to derive the greatest benefit in faith and hope, then cultivating an attitude of gratitude.

<u>Baked Goods Needed</u>: If you can help by donating cookies for our sale,





The carpet in the lounge will be cleaned during Christmas and New Year, while the Day School is on break.



PERSONAL NEEDS PANTRY OCTOBER UPDATE

In October, we served 138 adults and 65 children. 15 FSJ volunteers donated 30 hours of time this past month to make sure the pantry ran smoothly. We had a great month of donations due to Misson Sunday and a generous donation from the Perrysburg Rowing Team. On average, it is costing us \$330/ week to fund the pantry so every donation helps!


