# INTRODUCTION

Cradle and cross are inextricably connected on the fourth Sunday of Advent. Between a lovely tribute to the little town of Bethlehem and Mary's magnificent song of praise, the letter to the Hebrews reminds us in no uncertain terms that Christ's advent is for "the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all." It is the kind of tension in which the church always lives as when in holy communion—with high delight—"we proclaim the Lord's death."

#### FIRST READING: Micah 5:2-5a

The prophet Micah, having pronounced judgment upon Judah, speaks of a future shepherd-king who, like David, will come from the small town of Bethlehem. (Ephrathah refers to the area around Bethlehem.) This king will restore Israel and bring peace. New Testament writers understood this passage to be referring to Jesus.

<sup>2</sup> But you, O Bethlehem of Ephrathah, who are one of the little clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to rule in Israel, whose origin is from of old, from ancient days.

<sup>3</sup> Therefore he shall give them up until the time when she who is in labor has brought forth;

then the rest of his kindred shall return

to the people of Israel.

<sup>4</sup> And he shall stand and feed his flock in the strength of the Lord, in the majesty of the name of the Lord his God.

And they shall live secure, for now he shall be great to the ends of the earth;

<sup>5a</sup> and he shall be the one of peace.

# **Pregnant Pause**

Fresh from her encounter with the angel Gabriel, Mary runs to visit her older relative. Can you imagine this visit, this meeting of intimates? Two women pregnant with the promise of new life, pregnant with hope. Two women in their time of wonder and wondering--nine months full of expectation and mystery.

Unexpectedly, their lives have been graciously rearranged. One mother-to-be is expecting a child in her old age. The other will be the virgin mother of God. Surely each ponders what her life will be now, how it will change. What does it mean that God has chosen each for her particular task? What does it mean that each has said yes? What will the future hold?

In their holy moment of wondering and wonderment, Mary and Elizabeth lead us into a pregnant pause. We, too, ponder what God is doing in us and through us. We wonder what the future will bring.
