NOVEMBER FINANCIAL UPDATE For the month of November (2024 - 4 Sundays), FSJ income was \$28,939 & the expenses were \$26,590 for a **positive net income of \$2,349**! FSJ year to date finances has a deficit of \$19,607, which is an 10.70% improvement over the month of October. The entire FSJ staff & trustees did an excellent job in holding expenses down; most of the expense categories were below budget for the month & the congregation stewardship was strong. FSJ QCD's First St. John family, your church is considered a "qualified charitable distribution". Which means that you could reduce your adjusted gross income (AGI) & lower your tax bracket on the amount of taxes you pay with a donation from your retirement fund. But remember, the QCD must be completed by Dec. 31st, 2024, to count toward your annual required minimum distribution & the monies are directly transferred from your IRA custodian to the church.
